INTERSESSION SYLLABUS: FILM NOIR

Some of the films include Niagara with Marilyn Monroe, Hitchcock's Vertigo, Orson Welles' The Lady from Shanghai starring his soon-to-be ex-wife Rita Hayworth, and the bizarre and popular retelling of the Medea legend, Leave Her to Heaven, starring Gene Tierney. Requirements will include short commentaries on each film upon which we will base our class discussions as well as a final 5-7 page paper. All English Department courses at the 200-level and above (except ENG 208) are designated as "Writing" or "W" courses.
